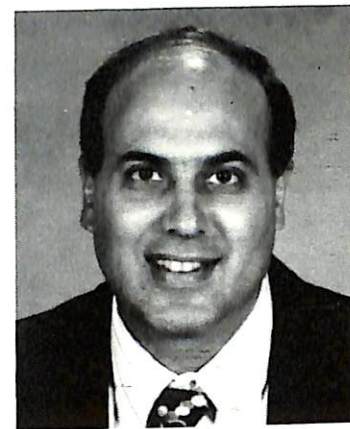

Game No. 3 - CINCINNATI ARCHBISHOP MOELLER

Starters returning from 1980 - 8
Additional lettermen returning - 37
Former Moeller head coach Gerry Faust, now at Notre Dame, has already predicted that the 1981 Moeller team will win the national title.
New Crusader head coach, Ted Bacigalupo, served for 12 years as defensive coordinator and linebacker coach. This is his first assignment as a head coach.
Moeller has 14 assistant coaches, one of whom is designated as "weight coach." This staff covers three teams, namely, Freshman, JV and Varsity elevens.
Key Personnel: Odom (G); Willging (QB); Francisco (RB); Clouse (RB); Parchman (T); Askin (T); Lima (DE); Davis (DT); Harmeyer (LB); and Brown (DHB).
Moeller will again outweigh every opponent on its schedule. With a great organization, Moeller is expected to slip very little in the next several years.

The Crusaders will probably play the strongest schedule in the state in 1981.

The Rams were Akron City champions in 1980 and should receive their strongest opposition from Central-Hower to retain the title.

The Panthers always have some "blue chip" personnel on their roster. Since 1960, the Tigers have made their poorest showing against Warren. Seven times the Tigers have lost to the Panthers in the last 21 games. Not even arch rival Canton McKinley has done as well as Warren.

After a disastrous second half of the season in 1980 this is a must year for the Panthers.

St. V annually obtains some of the outstanding talent in Summit County. The Irish usually have at least one "Division I college type" lineman on their roster.

The school has continuity in its coaching staff in that Cistone has been head mentor there for many years.

ORANGE UPDATE — 1981

The competition to stay on top in Ohio scholastic football is becoming more difficult each decade. Here is what some of our competitors and other Ohio high schools are doing or have done recently:

1. Barberton - \$100,000 weight and treatment room.
2. Warren Harding and Reserve - \$100,000 weight and treatment room.
3. Cincinnati Moeller - \$250,000 pole building for year around football drills.
4. Willoughby Eastlake North - Boosters raised \$75,000 in 1980 for athletic program.
5. Akron St. Vincent - Boosters have raised \$750,000 in past 25 years. Now raising \$100,000 annually.
6. Canton Glen Oak - Boosters raise \$50,000 annually for sports and other school activities. In 1979, special drive raised \$75,000 for Midget Football Program.
7. Youngstown Cardinal Mooney - Maintains the "500 club." Membership dues \$500.00 per year.
8. Canton McKinley - Organized in 1981, new Canton McKinley "Bulldog Athletic Club." Membership fee: \$100.00 or more. Membership to date: Over 100.
9. Navarre Fairless - Raised \$19,000 since January 1981 to equip a new Nautilus Room.
10. Alliance - Athletic Department provided room and \$10,000 for nautilus equipment for new head coach, Joel Cockley.

There are many other schools in Ohio pursuing numerous fund raising activities in an effort to provide the "little extra" in their athletic programs.

Hats off to the Massillon Tiger Swing Band for aggressive fund raising activities. Last year the band raised over \$80,000 for its overseas trip to England. We are all justifiably proud of one of America's finest scholastic bands.

Massillon Jackson is now in the process of raising \$190,000 so their band can participate in the Tournament of Roses Parade at Pasadena, California on January 1st.

It takes a lot of hard work and fund raising to keep a good athletic program moving forward. The slip backwards can come fast...just ask Alliance, Niles, and Steubenville.

Some high schools are becoming much more formidable through the consolidation of two schools within same community. This has occurred in Canton, Hamilton and a number of years ago at Cincinnati Princeton. Future consolidations may occur, with the rapid decline in student enrollment at Mansfield and Warren. It could also occur in Stark County.

After appearing on the Tiger schedule for 18 consecutive years, Niles McKinley bows out after the 1981 campaign. Once a power in Ohio scholastic football, the Red Dragons have compiled a 16-23-1 record over the past three years. Jack Pierson, former Warren Howland mentor, takes over as the new Niles head coach in 1981. He becomes the third head coach at Niles in the past five years.

Niles will become a full fledged member of the Steel Vally Conference

A common complaint of opponents is that Massillon does not play a sufficient number of away games. In 1980, the Tigers made five road appearances which is conveniently overlooked by the critics.

What some of our opponents are doing or will do...Canton McKinley is requiring all junior high school coaches to attend a series of coaching clinics being conducted by Head Coach Terry Forbes. CINCINNATI MOELLER's August practice schedule is as follows: squad workout - 9:00 AM to 11:00 AM; ball skills drills - (for quarterbacks, receivers and kickers), 12:30 PM to 2:00 PM; and squad workout - 3:00 PM to 5:00 PM. Each Sunday afternoon during the season exercise drills for entire squad.

Effective in 1982, Warren Harding has dropped Canton McKinley from its football schedule. Ironically, Warren has lost seven straight contests to the Bulldogs. Warren last won in 1973.

Warren enters the Steel Valley Conference on a full time basis in 1982 and therefore will have just the first three dates each year for non-conference foes. Econmically, this is a better move than continuing to compete against former members of the now defunct All American Conference.

The Panthers have at least temporarily, decided to continue their football relations with Massillon.

Cincinnati Moeller is giving top billing in its 1981 press booklet to its game with Massillon. This is no small honor considering that the Crusader play some very formidable opponents this fall in Centerville, Hampton, Va., Bethal Park, Cincinnati Elder, Cincinnati LaSalle, Lakewood St. Edward and Cincinnati Princeton.

Both Canton McKinley and Barberton appear on the 1982 and 1983 Moeller football schedules. McKinley will meet Moeller on the second date each year while Barberton appears on the fourth position.

The 89th renewal of the famous Canton-Massillon grid series set for Saturday, November 5, 1983 at Canton's Fawcett Stadium bears some resemblance to last year's clash.

Massillon will again enter the contest as the favorite, but not as the heavily favored team as in 1982. Again both teams will present familiar offensive threats. McKinley returns with KEVIN PARRISH (6-2, 200), QB, and TROY JENKINS, (5-10, 185), tailback, while the Tigers return BRIAN DEWITZ (5-10, 175), QB and CHRIS HELMAN (6-2, 218) running back.

Defensively, the Bulldogs will again have a very quick defense that swarms all over the ball carrier. The Tigers return another capable defense but admittedly not as quick as the Bulldogs.

Transfers: Anthony McCullough (6-4, 230) DT (Detroit); Jeff Smith (5-11, 175), DE (Canton Timken); and Tim Scaife (5-10, 150), DHB (Massillon Jackson. All are starters.

DIVISION I Prospects: Dale Jackson (6-4, 236) DE or DT; Shawn Fagan (6-3, 238), OT; McCullough and Jenkins.

Other Blue Chip Prospects: Jordan Kalaitzides (6-0, 251), OB; Pierre Taylor (6-0, 185), OE-S; and Leo Cadden (6-0, 200), OG-LB.

Male Enrollment (Soph.-Jr-Sr)..... 815

McKinley will be by a wide margin, the best team the Tigers will have faced in 1983 with the possible exception of Akron Garfield. McKinley has a quicker defense than Garfield, however the Rams may have a more potent running attack than the Bulldogs oneback offense featuring Troy Jenkins. Jenkins however has averaged about 150 yards per game. Parrish is a two year starter at quarterback and averages about 125 yards passing per game.

The game could be as close as the 1982 contest when the heavily favored Tigers struggled to eke out a 7-0 win.

The series record stands as 49-34-5 with Massillon in the lead. This record is somewhat misleading as the Bulldogs acquired 13 of their 34 victories during the first fifteen years of the series (1894-1908). Since 1909, Canton has only won 21 games while the Tigers have won 48.
