- 5' 9.5 inches tall - 140 lbs.
- BAT WAS 30" 46 ounces. (HIGH LIGHT bat?)
- "HIT 'em where they aint"
- CHOKED UP ON BAT (BUNTING PHOTO). N.Y. 1904
- played for all 3 N.Y. TEAMS (Highlanders, Giants & Brooklyn Superbas)
- BIGGEST impact with Baltimore Orioles (1894)
- PICTURE/LOGO ON HAT  IS OF Brooklyn Dodgers 
- may need to show as N.Y. (BUNTING?)

- WASHINGTON Senators 1915-1933
- Batted left handed / threw right handed
- Cleveland Indians 1934
- HOF 1963 (Veterans Committee)

### EDGAR

UNIFORM:  
 Finely spaced pinstripes  
 Trim color - navy blue  
 caps - navy blue w/ white  
 accent trim around base of  
 crown and edge of visor.

- \* made a controversial catch in the 1925 World Series (Senators v Pirates)  
 OVER FENCE and into stands  
 while alive kept the result of the catch to himself - half navy, half white (page 86)  
 Ruled an out.  
 wrote a letter that was sealed until his death in 1974  
 claiming that he had maintained possession of  
 the ball the entire time.

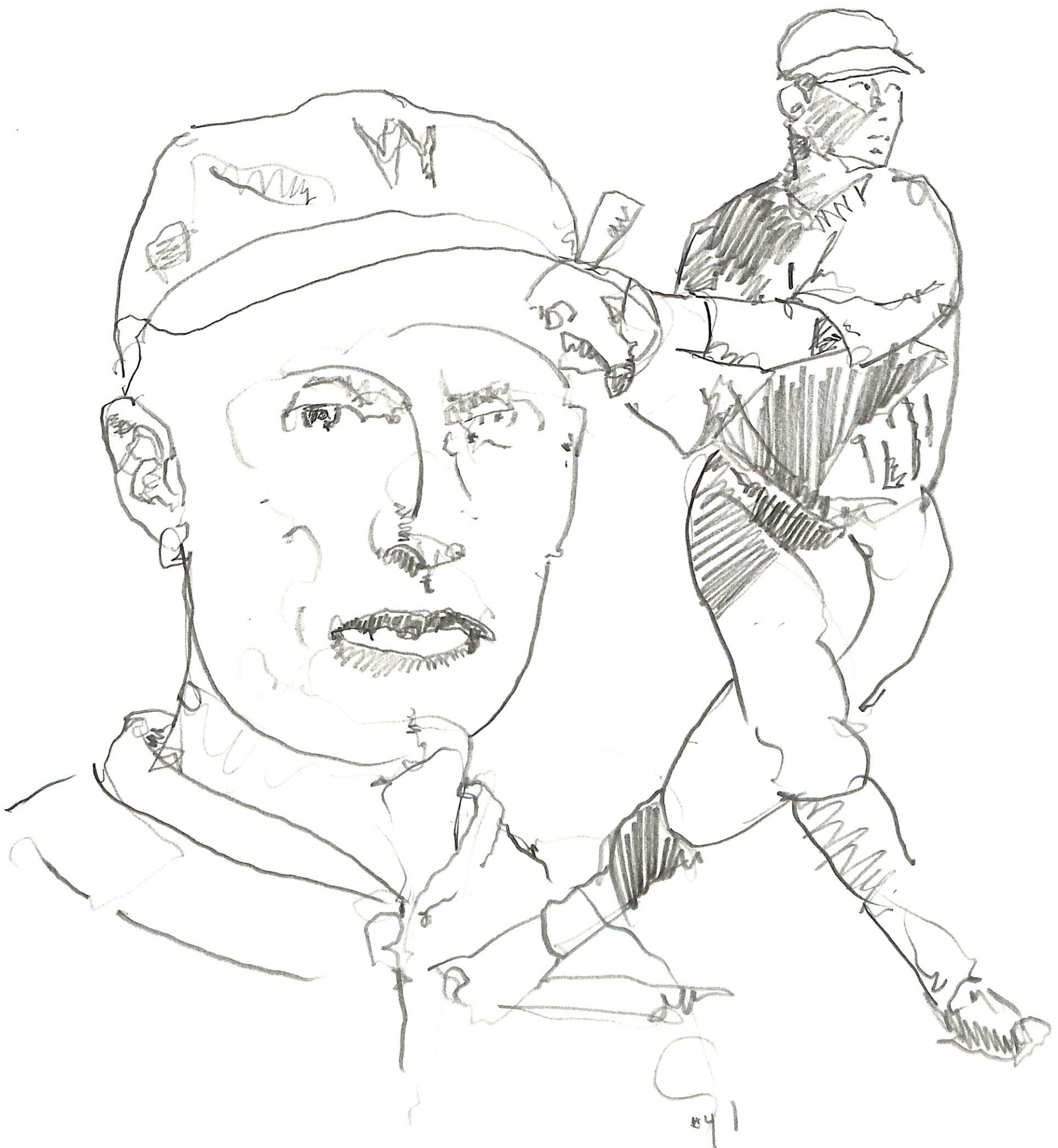
NAVY BLUE -  
 BLACK OR ORANGE  
 INTO A BLUE

- \* known as "EDDIE" during childhood.
- \* tornado wiped out his entire family, plus MOTHER BLACK + PRUSSIAN BLUE  
 & Dad (April 1912)
- \* stood erect @ plate - using wrists to slash pitches
- \* 1932 Studebaker "Same Rice Day" (Senators)
- \* 1920 stolen base total of 63 earned him the nick name

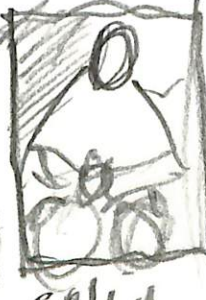

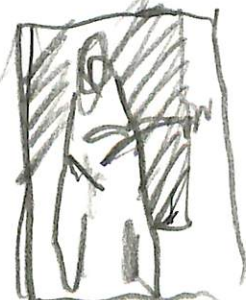

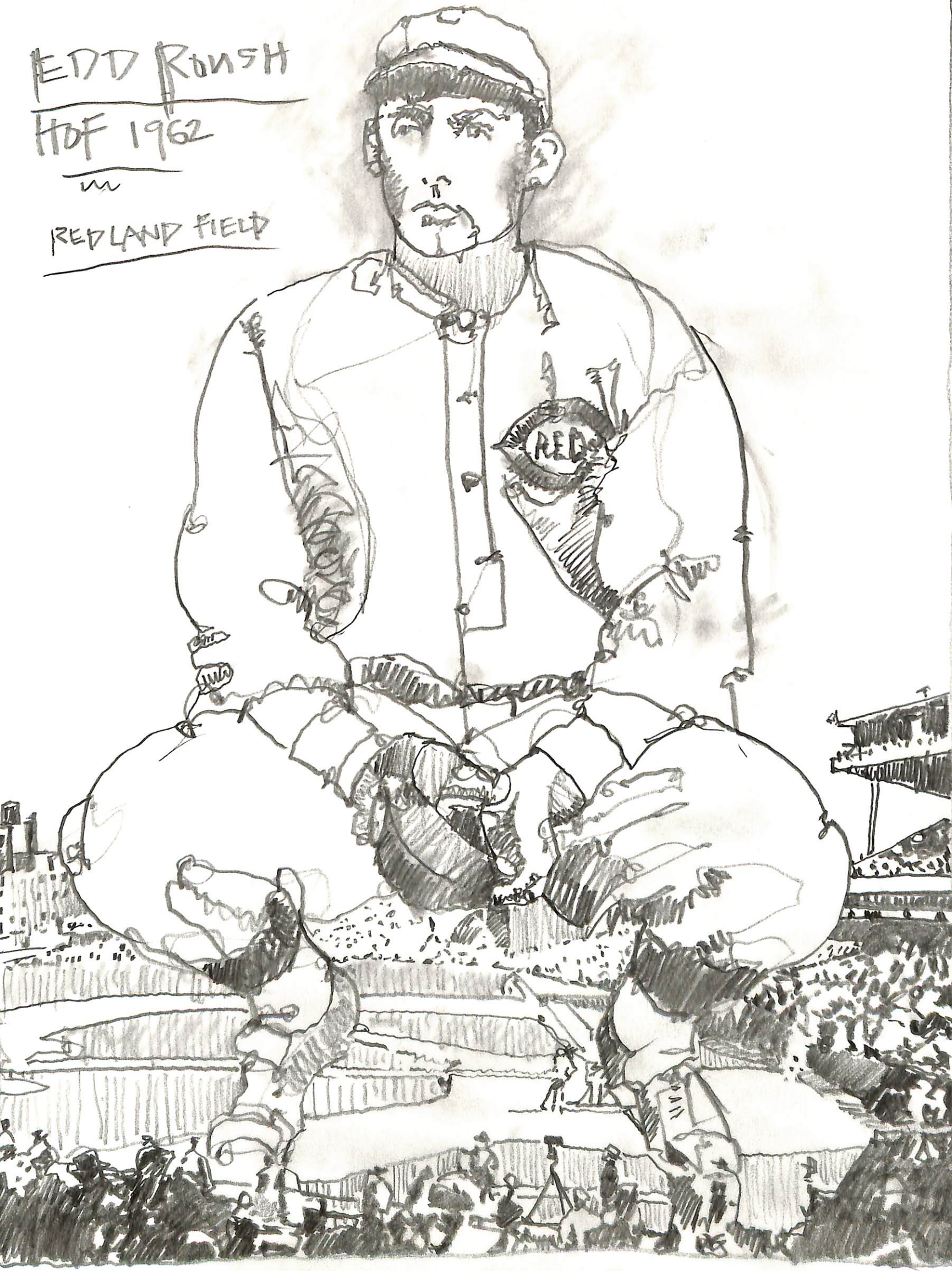

• TRADED to the Pirates in 1918

• Famous for his humorous and sometimes disjointed  
way OF SPEECH.

• major league debut at Brooklyn's Washington Park  
on 9.17.1912 - center field.

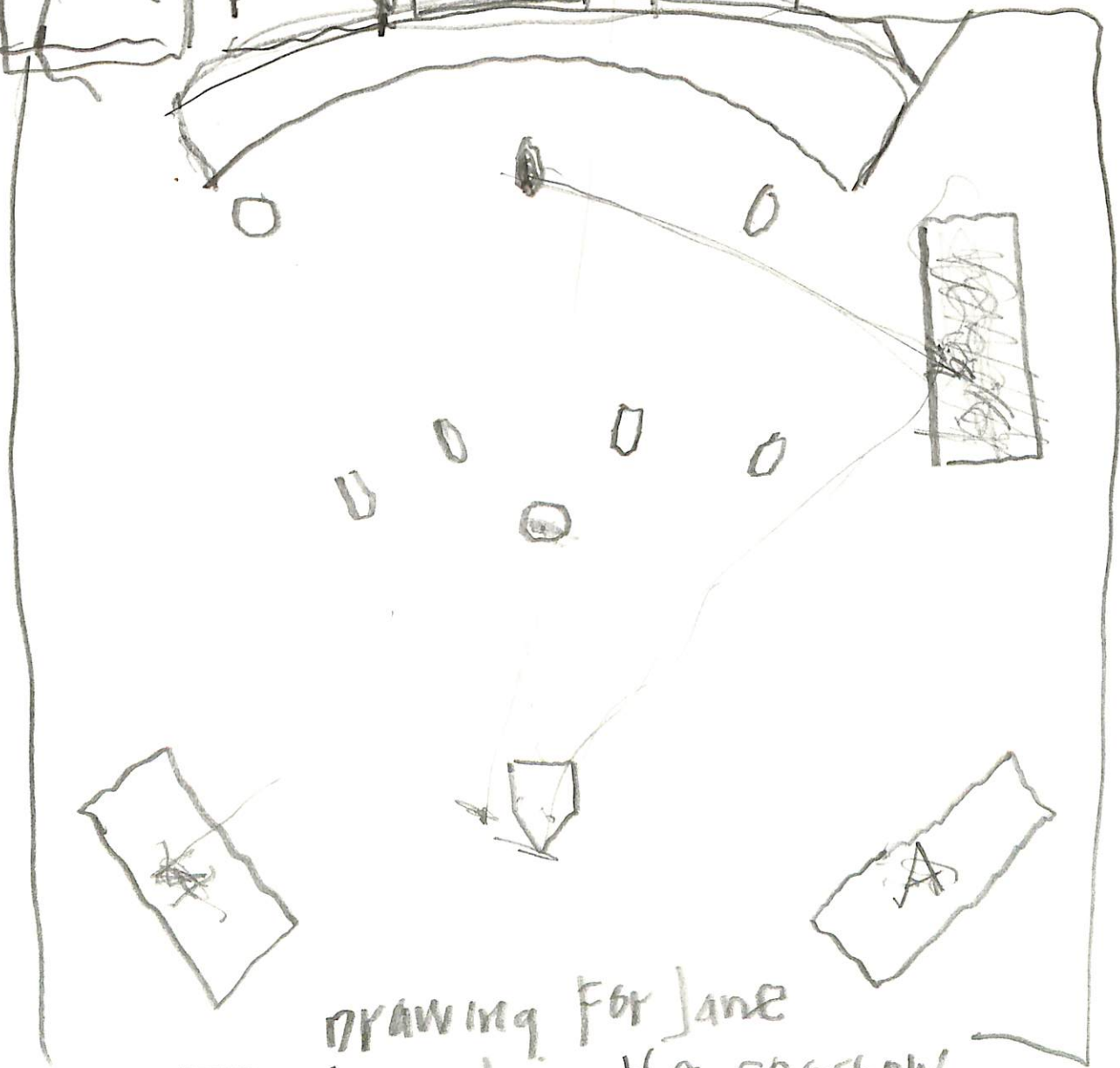
• first person to hit home run in the new hall park  
EBBETS Field.

• 1913 he acquired the nickname "Casey" - his bags  
had "CHARLES STENGEL - KC" stenciled on his  
bags

• BECAME ill (1915) team said he had typhoid fever  
after his death it was reported to be gonorrhoea

## ZACHARIAH DAVIS WHEAT ("BUCK")

- LEFT FIELD 1909-1927
- BROOKLYN DODGERS also known as ROBINS
- Played in Dead Ball Era, first part of career
- Dodgers all time franchise leader in hits, doubles, triples, RBI and total bases
- "Stylish and graceful outfielder"
- HOF 1959 (unanimously elected)
- corkscrew type of swing - held his hands down near the end of the bat.
- tiny feet/sizes.
